Be Prepared....

It is important that your unit is prepped and you are prepared for any and all treatments, including preventative treatment and K-9 inspection.

What does this mean:

- No debris/clutter on the floor
- All windows must be closed & A/C units off
 - No strong scents or fragrances.
- Secure all chemicals/cleaning products
- Pets must secured in a carrier or placed in the bathroom during treatment/inspection

You are given a notice of instructions ahead of time, so there is no excuse not to be prepared.

If not prepared at the time of treatment, you **will** be given a lease violation.

Parking Lot Guidelines:

Each unit is allowed **ONE** motor vehicle to be parked in the Leisure Manor resident parking lot. If a unit has more than one vehicle it **MUST** be parked across the street in the Blossom Heath Parking lot.

All tenants must display their LM parking sticker in the windshield on the lower front passenger's side.

All tenants must register plate number and vehicle description with the Commission Office. Changes in vehicle and or plates must be reported within 10 calendar days.

Unlicensed, inoperable or abandoned vehicles on LM properties are **PROHIBITED**.

The following actions be enforced for any resident not adhering to the parking policy:

- 1. Verbal warning
- 2. Lease violating
- 3. Vehicle will be towed at the owners expense.

Please follow the parking lot guidelines. We want to ensure that all of our residents have a place to park their vehicle.
