On June 19, 1865, enslaved African Americans in Galveston, Texas were told they were free.

On June 19, 1866, formerly enslaved people in Galveston, Texas, celebrated a year of emancipation, or freedom, with the "Juneteenth" holiday.

Juneteenth celebrations quickly spread to the rest of the country, and the date continues to be the oldest known tradition honoring the end of slavery in the United States.

Elder Abuse:

More than 73,000 older adults in Michigan are victims of elder abuse.

Elder abuse is classified as abuse, neglect or exploitation. Elder abuse is very complex, therefore recognizing the signs is extremely important.

Physical Signs:

- Dehydration or unusual weight loss
- Missing medication or medical assistive devices
- Unexplained injuries or sores
- Unsanitary living conditions or poor hygiene
- Unattended medical needs or missed appointments

Emotional/Behavioral Signs:

- Unusual changes in behavior or sleep patterns
- Withdrawal from normal activities
- Isolation from friends or family
- Hesitance to speak in presence of “caregiver”
- Increased anxiety or fear

Financial Signs:

- Unpaid bills
- Unusual changes in spending patterns (increases in ATM withdrawals or checks made out to cash or written out of order)
- Missing household items
- Purchases of large items the elder adult does not use

If you suspect someone is a victim of elder abuse, document your observations. Take photos and write notes on what you observed and when you observed it.
