On June 19, 1865, enslaved African Americans in Galveston, Texas were told they were free.

On June 19, 1866, formerly enslaved people in Galveston, Texas, celebrated a year of emancipation, or freedom, with the "Juneteenth" holiday.

Juneteenth celebrations quickly spread to the rest of the country, and the date continues to be the oldest known tradition honoring the end of slavery in the United

States.



-	Elder abuse is classified as abuse, neglect or loitation. Elder abuse is very complex, therefore recognizing the signs is extremely important.	
Phy	sical Signs:	
•]	Dehydration or unusual weight loss	
•]	Missing medication or medical assistive devices	
• 1	Unexplained injuries or sores	
• 1	Unsanitary living conditions or poor hygiene	
	Unattended medical needs or missed appointments	
Emo	otional/Behavioral Signs:	
• 1	Unusual changes in behavior or sleep patterns	
• 1	Withdrawal from normal activities	
•]	solation from friends or family	
•]	Hesitance to speak in presence of "caregiver"	
•]	Increased anxiety or fear	
Fina	ancial Signs:	
• 1	Unpaid bills
