### Seasonal Produce to Eat in the Spring:

With the Farmer's Market right around the corner, stock up on some fresh fruits and vegetables.

Foods that are in season contain vitamins, minerals and other nutrients our bodies need specifically for that season.

Spring veggies like radishes, asparagus, greens, herbs and lemon are great for detoxifying and cleansing the liver.

In addition, produce that is in season is in abundance and local, therefore prices are often cheaper.

Over the colder months, we get used to eating heartier produce, like potatoes and rutabaga. Springtime is when we should enjoy a bit more variety of fresh herbs, veggies and even some sweet and juicy berries.

#### Here are some delicious seasonal produce picks to consider adding to your plate this spring:

**Fruits:** cherries, strawberries, mango, pineapple, kiwi, apricots, grapefruit, lemons & rhubarb

**Veggies:** peas, spinach, leeks artichokes kale, lettuce, arugula, asparagus, beets, carrots & turnips

**Herbs:** parsley, cilantro, chives, green onion, basil, & dill



The best way to know whether or not something is in season is to go to a local farmer's market!

#### The St. Clair Shores Farmer's Market is Back!

The first farmer's market of the season will take place on Sunday, May 19th from 11am-8pm. Flowers, food trucks and beer tent will kick off the start of the season!

The farmer's market is held on the 4th Sunday, from 8am-2pm, and the 2nd Thursday of the month, from 5pm-9pm, from May through October.

The farmer's market is an open air market that features fresh locally grown Michigan produce, locally produced foods and handmade goods/products.

- 62 years & older-Individual \$5

- Under 62 years old-Individual \$7
- Under 62 years old-Couple \$10

Do NOT throw away your park pass at the end of the season. Park passes can be renewed on a yearly basis.

Park passes are required starting May 1st through October 31st. Passes not required at special events!

### Tenant Council Summer Break:

There will be no Tenant Council meetings from June through August. Tenant Council meetings will resume in September.

### Building Reminders:

All work orders **MUST** be reported to the office immediately so they can be addressed in a timely manner.

**REMINDER:** Not reporting a work order is a serious lease violation. In addition, unreported work orders can often lead to further damage in the unit if left untreated.

As the temperatures rise you may decide to turn on your air conditioning. Please call the office to place a work order to have your air conditioning cover removed. A/C covers are stored in your unit.

Dogs must be on a leash at all times. For safety reasons, retractable leashes are strictly **prohibited**. The length of the lease must not exceed 72".

**Remember, you must clean up after your pet. All pet waste must go in the appropriate receptacles. Failure to do so is a serious matter and may result in a lease violation.**
